GENERAL INFORMAITON

VENUE

- Bedford Academy School, Mile Road, Bedford MK42 9TR .
- There are no covered areas, so we recommend you bring gazebos and set up on the grass areas. Please set up on the right of the field and not on the coned off football pitch to the left.
- There are no changing rooms so do not rely on these please.
- Toilets will be open inside the school by the café and community entrances which will be clearly signposted. There are limited toilets so please be aware there will be queues.

- **No dogs are allowed on the Academy grounds**
- **No smoking, vaping or alcohol is allowed** anywhere on the Academy grounds. Academy site staff are in attendance for the day so please respect these rules.
- Bedford Academy has a café where hot and cold drinks, ice creams, snacks and food can be purchased throughout the day. The Academy will also have a hot drink stand outside the courts. **Please be aware it is cashless vending you can only pay by credit/debit card. (See appendix 1 for menu)**
- There will be black bin bags supplied to each team in the welcome bag. Please use them for any litter and ensure you take the bag home with you to dispose of.

PARKING

If you attended last year, please note that the parking situation has changed slightly due to building work in progress on part of the previous parking and grassed areas. To help alleviate the situation we have secured additional parking at the Bunyan Centre, conveniently located next door. We will have parking attendants in high visibility jackets to aid a smooth and stress-free arrival at both sites. Where possible please encourage your teams to car share.

There will still be specific areas for minibuses and coaches in the Academy car park, please let us know beforehand if you wish to reserve one of these spots for you. Likewise, if a disabled parking space is required kindly email bcnachair@gmail.com. (Before 15th April).

If you park at the Academy access to the outdoor courts is through the school. Once parked please enter the school through the **Community Entrance (not main reception)**.

If you park in the Bunyan Centre access to the outdoor courts is alongside the courts.

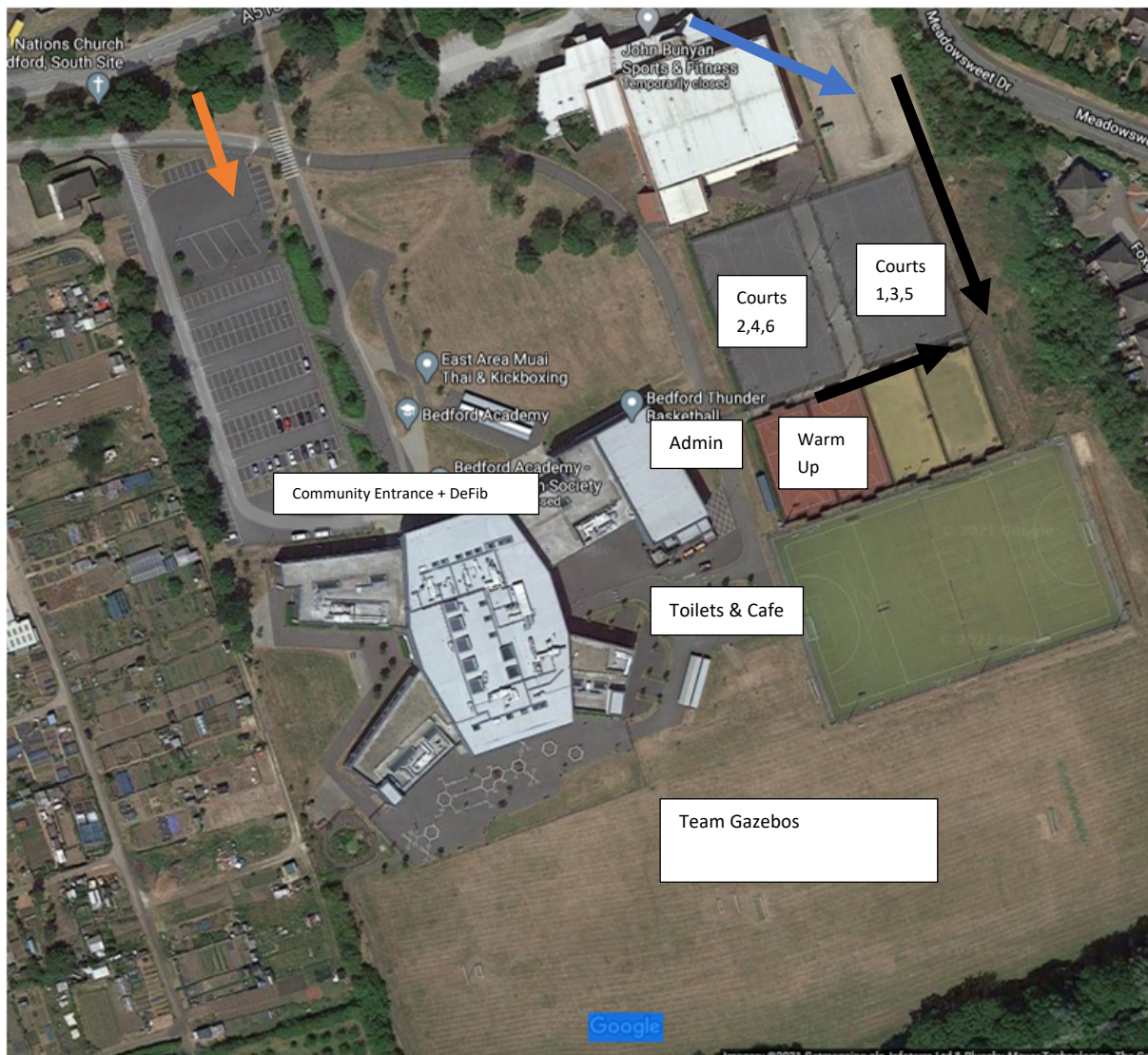
Please see below a site map to assist with your planning. We recommend arriving early to allow ample time for parking and accessing the venue.

Blue Arrow - Bunyan Centre car park.

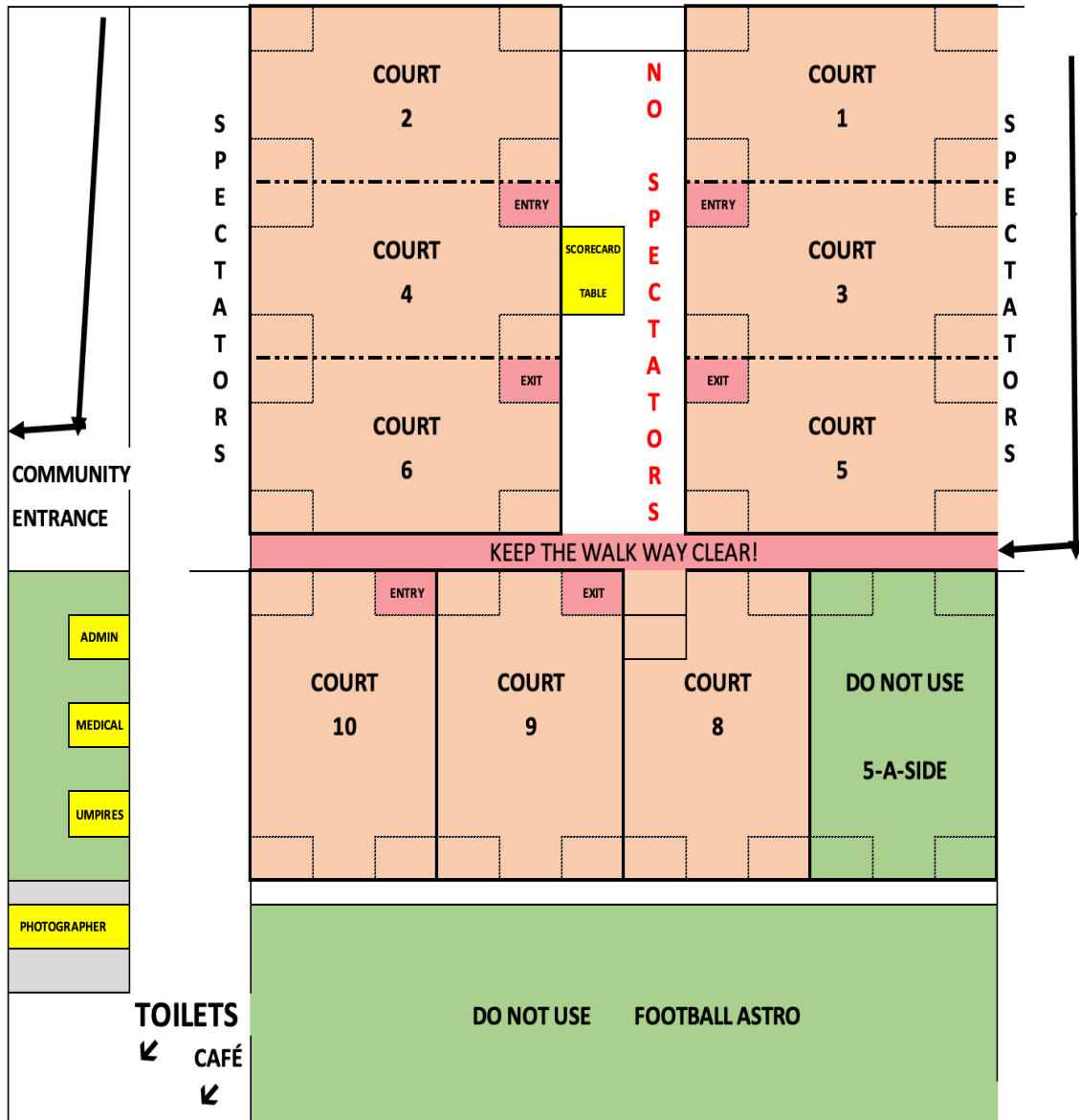
Gate from Bunyan Centre parking with walkway to netball courts (next to court 5).

- The Outdoor Warm Up Courts are Courts 9 & 10 and will be available from 9.10 am.
- The Outdoor Match Day courts are Courts 1,3 and 5 & 2,4 and 6 and will be available for warmups from 9am until the matches start at 10am.
- Only the squad, support staff and scorers are allowed inside the match court and warm up areas.
- ABOLUTELY no spectators are permitted in between the two sets of courts. We also request that no teams congregate in this area and the walkways are kept clear and accessible for the safety of all.
- Spectators can observe from outside the perimeter fences on either side of the courts. Entry/Exit systems will be in place to court areas.
- The outdoor warm up courts are Courts 9&10 (see map page 6&7) throughout the day.

SAFEGUARDING & WELFARE

The safeguarding and welfare of all players are the responsibility of the accompanying adults from each team. It is expected that coaches, team managers and parents take appropriate measures to ensure the safety and well-being of their players throughout the tournament. BCNA will conduct risk assessment and manage necessary precautions related to the venue, parking, and courts to provide a safe environment for all participants. However, team officials must always remain vigilant and accountable for their players.

BAD WEATHER AND EMERGENCY PLANS

All counties have already provided a contact mobile number on their entry form for any last-minute communications prior to the event.

If the event needs to be cancelled, the relevant parties will be contacted as early as possible via phone and social media.

Rules and Regulations

1. RULES OF THE GAME

- 1.1 All matches shall be played to the WN Rules of Netball (2024) currently in force at the time of the Competition except where specific Tournament Regulations apply.
- 1.2 **Reminder:** No jewellery, body piercings or adornments that may endanger player safety may be worn. There will be no exceptions unless these are for medical or religious reasons.
- 1.3 Tactical changes will be allowed but only if done quickly and efficiently, however the Umpire have the right to refuse a tactical change if close to the end of the game.

2. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Must have trained during the 2024/25 with their U13/U15 PDP groups for at least the last three months on a minimum of a fortnightly basis.
- 2.2 All players must be affiliated to England Netball – each County is responsible for this.

3. REGISTRATION OF SQUAD MEMBERS

- 3.1 The maximum number of players allowed is a squad of twelve (12)
- 3.2 The coaches and support staff (Maximum of 4, excluding scorer) and up to 5 players, need to stand right of the post on the goal line, the defending end, at the start of each match.

4. BALLS, BIBS & PLAYING KIT

- 4.1 All teams will provide a size 5 match ball.
 - 4.1.1 The first named team on the playing schedule will provide the match ball.
- 4.2 All players must wear positional bibs and teams must have a spare set in a different colour in the event of clash of colours.
 - 4.2.1. In the event of a clash of bib colours, the second named team on the playing schedule will play in alternative-coloured bibs.

5. MATCH POINTS

- 5.1 Match points will be awarded as follows:
 - 5 points for a win
 - 3 points for a draw
 - 2 points within 5 goals and less of the winning team's score
 - 1 point if 50% or above of the winnings team's score

6. SCHEDULE AND SCORING

- 6.1 **In Round 1-19** (inclusive) draws **WILL** be permitted.
- 6.2 **In Round 20 and 21** a draw will **NOT** be permitted in any of the matches. All matches must be played to a result i.e. no draw.

If the scores are a draw at the end of "normal time" two minutes each way extra time will be added. If the score remains a draw after extra time, play continues until a golden goal is scored (i.e. the next goal).

- 6.3 **In Round 22,23 24 and 25** of the schedules a draw **will be permitted in all Play Offs except for the 1st and 2nd Place** and this must be played to a result i.e. no draw.

If the score is a draw at the end of "normal time" two minutes each way extra time will be added. If the score remains a draw after extra time play continues to a golden goal is scored (i.e. the next goal).

- 6.4 For those umpiring matches where no draw is allowed the score will be announced during the extra time, so you know if you need to continue to a golden goal.

7. TIED POINTS

- 7.1 In the event of a tie on points, goal ratio will decide the placings (goals for, divided by goals against, to 3 decimal points within the highest result, producing the better performance).
- 7.2 If goal ratio is identical then goal difference will be applied (the difference between goals for and goals against).
- 7.3 If goal difference is identical, the result of the last match between the two teams at this tournament will be the decider.
- 7.4 In the event of a further tie, the team with the most goals for, will be declared the winner.

8. SCORING AND TIME KEEPING

- 8.1 There will be central timing, for the start and finish of the match as well as start and end of half time and all play will start and stop on the umpire's whistle.
- 8.2 Centre passes and shooting direction must be decided by both teams involved in advance of the match starting.
- 8.3 A team can only compete if a minimum of 5 players are on court. Any team failing to take the court at the start of the game will be penalised by the loss of 2 goals for each minute or part minute for which they are late on court and the goals will be added to the opponent's score. If a team fails to take to the court after 3 minutes, the game will be awarded to the non-offending team, and a score of 12.0 awarded.
- 8.4 There is no injury time, within reason, the injured player must leave the court immediately.
- 8.5 If there is a serious injury and the umpires stop the game, it will be at the discretion of the Tournament Referee if the game is to be extended, replayed or the score stands.
- 8.6 Each team will provide a scorer for their own matches, and they will stand with the other team's scorer.
- 8.7 The score cards will be taken to the scorer's table by the 'game makers' allocated to the courts.

9. APPEALS/PROTESTS/DISPUTES PROCEDURE

- 9.1 Appeals/protest/disputes shall be submitted to the Tournament Referee in writing and signed by the most senior official of the County submitting the appeal present at the event.
- 9.2 This to be submitted within 10 minutes of the end of the game, or of the occurrence of the incident on which the appeal/protest/dispute is based.
- 9.3 The Tournament Referee shall deliver the written decision to the Team Manager/Official who submitted the appeal/protest/dispute within 30mins of it being submitted. A copy of the decision shall also be given to the other party involved, if applicable.

10. UMPIRES

- 10.1 Umpires must be fully conversant with these Tournament Regulations and Umpire specific regulations.
- 10.2 Umpires will be appointed by BCNA.

11. MEDICAL

- 11.1 All teams to be responsible for their own immediate/straightforward first aid, as necessary.

12. SUPPORTERS

- 12.1 Spectators to remain outside of the court playing area.
- 12.2 No spectators permitted in between the two sets of courts or surrounds.
- 12.3 Spectators can observe from the perimeter fences on either side. Please move away from these areas when your team is not playing.

13. LIABILITY

- 13.1 BCNA accepts no liability whatsoever in respect of personal loss or injury which players, officials or spectators may sustain.
